

Title: Assistant Instructor Motorcycle Rider Program

Job Category: Faculty

Months of Appointment: Per Grant

Position Summary: The School of Human Sciences at Southern Illinois University Carbondale is seeking an Assistant Instructor position to also serve as Coordinator (Assistant) for the Motorcycle Rider Program. This is a 12-month, 100% (1.0 FTE) term non-tenure track appointment based on the Motorcycle Rider Program grant year. This position is contingent upon receiving grant funding. Final candidate and salary must be approved by granting agency. Salary and rank are commensurate with experience and background.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Teach instructor preparation courses including PH346 – MOTORCYCLE INSTRUCTOR TRAINING. Courses include driver (rider) education or instruction, safety principles, adult learning principles, motor skills principles, brain-based learning, attitudinal development, judgment, facilitation, communication, in addition to supervising, and evaluating instructors and course aides. Instruction consists of both classroom and field instruction.

Teach students in driver (rider) instruction and oversee the teaching of students at various levels of experience and skill in safety aspects of motorcycle operation, skills, safety processes, and strategies. Instruction consists of both classroom and field instruction.

Assist with grant related tasks such as: development of course schedules; recruiting, training, and evaluating instructional staff; completing monthly, quarterly, annual and miscellaneous reports to Illinois Department of Transportation; grant proposals and management; budget development; and expenditure oversight.

Provide site support tasks such as: locating and creating agreements for additional and replacement training sites; assisting in site set-ups, maintenance, and teardowns; procure, manage, and maintain motorcycles and other training equipment and transport motorcycles and other training equipment.

Other duties as assigned

*Work hours are irregular and require travel.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree.
- Currently hold Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) RiderCoach certification. MSF RiderCoach Trainer Certification must be attained within 18 months of hire if not held at the time of hire.
- Valid State of Illinois Class M driver's license or equivalent from another state and a safe riding and driving record are required.
- Motorcycle safety teaching experience, qualifications, and knowledge.
- Must be first aid certified.
- Effective verbal and written communication skills to interact with staff, site sponsors, media, students and the general public is required.

Preferred Qualifications:

MSF RiderCoach Trainer certification

Have an in depth understanding of the SIU grant project and Illinois Cycle Rider Safety Training Program.

Possess a technical understanding of motorcycle mechanics and the ability to troubleshoot motorcycle mechanical and electrical systems

Previous experience with maintaining fleet motorcycles.

Training in teaching advanced motorcycle safety courses.

Have a valid class A CDL (Combination Vehicle) driver's license or its equivalent from another state.
